OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY PARISH FEBRUARY 23 2025 | SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORD TIME | YEAR C



Historical source for dating the New Testament: e.g. Irenaeus, an early Bishop of Lyon, France, wrote that as a child, he heard and saw St. Polycarp, the last known living connection with the Apostles, especially John. Irenaeus stated that "Matthew also issued a written Gospel among the Hebrews in their own dialect, while Peter and Paul were preaching at Rome, and laying the foundations of the Church...Afterward, John, the disciple of the Lord, who also had leaned upon His breast, did himself publish a Gospel during his residence at Ephesus in Asia."

The great persecution under the Emperor Diocletian often focused on searching for and destroying the Christians' libraries and scriptoriums - institutes where the Scriptures were copied by hand. This persecution reached its peak in 303 and was the most pervasive persecution in Roman history. It continued on and off and in varying degrees in different places until 313 with the Edict of Milan and the rise of the Emperor Constantine, granting Christians freedom of religion. The persecution failed to check the rise of the Church and historians squabble over the extent and degree of severity of it.

The oldest and most complete copies of the Bible:

Codex Vaticanus: An almost complete edition of the Bible written in Greek known as the Septuagint – which was originally compiled in Alexandria, Egypt. The early history of the Codex is uncertain with scholars arguing for places as diverse as Rome, South Italy, Caesarea in Turkiye and Alexandria in Egypt. The Codex is generally assigned to the middle of the fourth century (350 CE) and considered contemporary or slightly earlier than Codex Sinaiticus (See below). It is written on velum (calf skin) which is much more durable than papyrus). It possibly came into the Vatican Library where it was taken for safekeeping after the fall of Constantinople (now Istanbul) to the Muslim Ottomans in1453. It fell into the hands of the marauding self-proclaimed Emperor of France, Napoleon Bonaparte, but was returned to the Vatican in 1815 at the end of his military career.

Codex Sinaiticus: Most of this text is held in the British Library in London. It is a fourth-century manuscript of the Septuagint, containing the majority of the Old Testament and the New Testament, with both the Epistle of Barnabas and the Shepherd of Hermas (early Christian writings but not part of the Bible Canon) included. Like Vaticanus, it is written on parchment. Scholars discovered it in the Monastery of St Catherine at the foot of Mt Sinai in 1844.

Codex Alexandrinus: it has been dated to the fifth century. It derives its name from the city of Alexandria, Egypt, where it resided for a number of years before it was brought by the Eastern Orthodox Patriarch from Alexandria to Constantinople. It was then given to Charles I of England in the 17th century and is kept in the British Library.

Work-Health-Safety at OLR. Every 6 months we have to do a survey of WHS issues in the parish. Here are some matters we need to attend to:

FIRE WARDENS: We need to have Fire Wardens at each Mass in case something (unlikely) happens. We have so few flame points – in fact only two – and they are the candles on the Altar. But still we need people who have been trained to operate Fire Extinguishers – which means KNOWING where they are located in the Church and Sacristies; Which Extinguishers to use depending on the source of the fire – electric, paper/wood etc... and HOW to



actually OPERATE the Extinguishers. I think the prime candidates for this are the Acolytes – as they are rostered on at Masses and so are always there? (3) Your thoughts please. PHMSC

Does anyone in the Congregation have **experience and expertise** in **operating Fire Extinguishers** and who may be **able to train the Priest and the Acolytes on how to use them**, (When I Was P/T Chaplain at POW for 12 years, each year we had to do a mandatory Fire Emergency Practical Course in handling Extinguishers and evacuation procedures...alas, these things do not stick in my memory for too long.)

If you have the capacity to train others in operating Fire Extinguishers, please contact the Office: 9663 1070 and your path to Beatification will be initiated. PHMSC



FIRST AID: We are supposed to have a First Aid person at our Masses – particularly Weekend Masses. So, we are looking for parishioners who are Doctors, Nurses, Paramedics or otherwise have a current First Aid certificate. It is just so that we can make a list of them for the Masses you may normally attend and call on you should an emergency occur during the Mass.


Kindly let Maria at the Office know **your willingness to be identified**, with your phone number so that we can register that in our Sacristy. Otherwise, of course, 000 is the number to call – but in the time it takes an ambulance to arrive, it can be a comfort to know we have **qualified personnel** at our Masses to take charge. PHMSC

EMERGENCY EVACUATION POINT: In case of an emergency (e.g. fire): leave via Front and Side doors and congregate near the Kensington Rd Hall Entrance. Make sure you have with you all who came with you to the Mass or Ceremony. From the Rosary Room, if safe, proceed up the side path to Hall — otherwise go via the Parish Office Side to the Hall entrance. (This Sign needs to be posted on the Kensington Rd Hall Entrance). 
