OUR LADY OF THE ROSARY PARISH AUGUST 17 2025 | TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORD TIME | YEAR C

The two saints featured below focus our attention on the Second World War and its cruelty, and how the Light of Christ shone within that darkness in these two out of millions of unknown souls.

August 9^{th:} St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross – Edith Stein, martyr of Auschwitz. (1891-1942). Edith Stein was the 11th child of a Jewish family, from Breslau, Germany. Gifted with a brilliant intellect, she decided she was an atheist by the age of 15 and declared she would never pray again! As she recalled later, "My quest for truth was my only prayer."

In her search for truth, she studied psychology, history and philosophy at Freiburg, Germany. There she eventually studied under Max Scheler who influenced her thinking to include a Catholic understanding of love and sacrifice in her philosophical worldview. She wrote, "The barricades of my rationalist prejudices were lifted to reveal the world of faith."

Providentially she read over the space of one night, the Autobiography of the great Carmelite **St Teresa of Avila** and declared: "This is the Truth!"

She was baptized a Catholic at age 31 in 1922. She entered the Carmelite Nuns' Monastery at Cologne in 1933 just after Hitler came to power. She said, "Henceforth my only vocation will to be to love more." Hitler was able to use the scarcely dormant antisemitism in Germany which had a centuries-long history to turn the Jews into scapegoats for the economic turmoil which followed the First World War.

Approximately 500,000 Jews, representing less than 1% of the population, lived in Germany prior to WWII. As a result, cruelty never before seen in the history of racial persecution was exacted upon the Jews, firstly in Germany and then across Europe. In 1936 the infamous

Nurenberg Laws were passed: Jews were segregated, deprived of citizenship, without status. A Catholic lawyer devised these laws! Soon after Jews were transported to concentration camps, especially the nearby Auschwitz work/liquidation camp in conquered Poland.

In 1938 Sr Teresa and her sister Rosa, by then also a Carmelite extern Sister, were transferred from Cologne Carmel to the Carmelites in Echt, Holland, to escape Nazis persecution. On 2 August 1942 the Bishops and Protestant leaders of by then occupied Holland issued a Pastoral Letter unambiguously condemning Nazism. However, the German Bishops did not, and the Pope did not issue a clear broadcast against Nazism. The very next day the Nazis arrested 244 convert Jews, including the Carmelites Teresa and Rosa. They were transported by cattle box car to Auschwitz-Birkenau in Poland. On the 9th of August, soon after their arrival, they were gassed and cremated, two victims along with 1,250,000 mainly Jewish people to be liquidated in that one location. As she was arrested, she said to her sister, "Come, we are on our way to our own people." She is remembered as a person who walked in love through the most terrible absence of mercy and compassion in recorded history - in union with the sufferings of Christ. St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, pray for us that we do not become indifferent to our own faith. PHmsc various sources

(Continued from P.1) August 14th: St. Maksymilian Maria Kolbe martyr of Auschwitz, Poland, 1894 - August 14, 1941.

In 1906 aged 12, Maksymilian had a vision of Our Lady in which she offered him a white crown and a red crown and asked which he would accept. Understanding the white to represent a life of purity and the red to represent martyrdom, he said he would accept them both. The vision deeply affected him, and the following year he and his elder brother joined the Franciscan Conventuals in their High School.

In 1918 he was ordained a priest in Rome and on his return to Poland he established the popular periodical "The Knight of Mary Immaculate". In 1927 he founded the City of Mary Immaculate, a religious centre, that eventually attracted some 700 Franciscans and workers. Later he founded a monastery and printery in Nagasaki, Japan which survived the bombing as it was over the ride of a hill from the city.

Upon his return to Poland, Kolbe became superior of the City of Mary Immaculate and director of Poland's chief Catholic publishing complex. In 1938 the centre started its own radio station. He was arrested by the Gestapo in 1939 for his anti-Nazism but was later released. He continued to publish against the Nazis while the remaining brothers used the centre to shelter an estimated 2,000–3,000 Polish refugees, the majority of whom were Jewish. He was again arrested in February 1941 on charges of aiding Jews and the Polish underground.

He was transported to Auschwitz. There he continued his priestly ministry, including hearing confessions and celebrating Mass with smuggled bread and wine for which he was subjected to beatings by the guards. In retaliation for a prisoner who had escaped, the deputy camp commander picked out 10 men to be starved to death in an underground bunker. When one of the selected men, Franciszek Gajowniczek, cried out, "My wife! My children!", Fr Kolbe volunteered to die in his place. "Kolbe left the ranks, risking being killed on the spot, to ask the camp leader to replace me," recalled the prisoner who survived Auschwitz to see Kolbe declared a Saint.

Maximilian and 9 others were locked up in the "starvation bunker" without food and water. According to an eyewitness, who was a forced worker-prisoner in that Block, Fr Kolbe led the prisoners in prayer. After they had been starved and deprived of water for two weeks, only Fr Kolbe remained alive. The prison authorities who wanted the bunker emptied, gave him a lethal injection of carbolic acid killing him on August 14. Before dying, he pronounced the two words, "Ave Maria". His remains were cremated on 15 August, the feast of the Assumption of Mary.

In 1982 Pope John Paul II canonized him in the presence of the Polish man Fr Kolbe saved and his family. During his visit to Poland in 2016, Pope Francis visited the "starvation bunker". He signed the visitors' book with a brief prayer: "Lord, have mercy on your people. Lord, forgive us for so much cruelty". Fr Kolbe's faith and charity, inspired by his profound love of Mary, was a clear light witnessing to the dignity of the human person, shining in the vortex of evil and darkness represented by Auschwitz.


