Year C, Year of St Luke:

The oldest known copy (incomplete) of the Gospel of St Luke. It is known as the Papyrus Bodmer P14 -15 and was written around 175 – 225 BCE. Found in 1952 at Pabau in Egypt, the ancient headquarters of the Pachmonium Christian monks. Together with other manuscripts it was smuggled into Switzerland to the Bodmer Library in Geneva. P14-15 was later transferred to the Vatican.

P 14-15 is believed to contain also the earliest known Lord's Prayer and one of the oldest written fragments from the Gospel of John. It is also the oldest manuscript that contains two Gospels – Luke and John. This could be interpreted to suggest that after this period the four Gospels were circulated together.

Papyrus was made from the stem of the papyrus plant, very common in Egypt and the Mediterranean area — a relatively cheap and available source of writing material. "In Greek and Roman milieus, formal texts were exclusively transmitted on papyrus scrolls whereas informal texts (accounts, notes, receipts...) were transcribed on other types of support, such as wax tablets or pottery." "In the first century A.D., 'notepads' made of superimposed sheets folded and sewn together or tied with a piece of string became common."

P 14-15, (Luke) originally consisted of 36 double leaves placed one on top of the other to make a total of 144 pages of which 101 leaves survived.

<u>Other ancient fragments of the New Testament</u>: Those listed below come from the Second Century.

P52 (100-150AD): the earliest and most famous Greek New Testament manuscript is in the Ryland (Library in the UK). Bought at an Egyptian market in 1920. It contains parts of seven lines from John 18. It attests to the widespread dissemination of the New Testament in the Early Church period.

P90 (late C2) is a small fragment of papyrus also with portions of the Gospel of John (18:36-19:7) on both sides in Greek - part of a group of manuscripts discovered in the ancient garbage dump near Oxyrhynchus, Egypt.

P104 (early C2) - Matt. 21:34-37 on the front, and traces of verses 43 and 45 on the back. **P98** – first chapter of the book of Revelation.

Historical source for dating the New Testament: e.g. Irenaeus, an early Bishop of Lyon, France, wrote that as a child, he heard and saw St. Polycarp, the last known living connection with the Apostles, especially John. Irenaes stated that "Matthew also issued a written Gospel among the Hebrews in their own dialect, while Peter and Paul were preaching at Rome, and laying the foundations of the Church...Afterward, John, the disciple of the Lord, who also had leaned upon His breast, did himself publish a Gospel during his residence at Ephesus in Asia." Irenaeus also wrote that the Book of Revelation was composed, "almost in our day, towards the end of Domitian's reign." The Emperor Domitian reigned from A.D. 81-96, which is one of the reasons many scholars believe the book of Revelation was written by the Apostle John sometime in the 90's.

PLENARY INDULGENCE: 2025 THE JUBILEE YEAR OF HOPE

A Plenary Indulgence **for the souls in purgatory** may be gained for those who visit a nominated Shrine (e.g. Locally, OLSH Randwick, St Brigid's Coogee, Mt Carmel Waterloo, the Cathedral and St Patrick's the Rocks).

What is a Plenary Indulgence? It has its roots in Scripture and in the tradition from the Early Church. Pope Paul VI taught: "An indulgence is a remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already



been forgiven, which the faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains under certain defined conditions through the Church's help when, as a minister of redemption, she dispenses and applies with authority **the treasury of the satisfactions won by Christ and the saints**". So, sin is forgiven, but reparation may still be required in justice – hence Purgatory.

To gain a Plenary Indulgence the following conditions must be fulfilled:

1. Detachment from all sin, even venial. 2. Sacramental confession, holy Communion, and 3. Prayer for the intentions of the pope (normally an Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory be, or your own choice...). These three conditions can be fulfilled up to 20 days before or after performing the works to gain the indulgence, but it is appropriate that Communion and the prayer take place on the same day that the work is completed.

A single sacramental confession is sufficient for several plenary indulgences, but frequent sacramental confession is encouraged in order to obtain the grace of deeper conversion and purity of heart. For each plenary indulgence that is sought, however, a separate holy Communion and a separate prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father are required.

How to make a Plenary Indulgence - Make a pilgrimage to Rome. (The Archdiocese is advertising one.) Perform works of Mercy: e.g. visiting prisoners, spending time with lonely elderly people, aiding the sick or disabled, and helping those who are in need as instances to obtain an indulgence; Donating "a proportionate sum of money to the poor"; supporting religious or social works, especially in the defence of life in all phases; offering support to migrants, the elderly, the poor, young people in difficulty, and abandoned children; volunteering in service to your community (not limited to the Church community). Practicing the works of mercy, the Decree says, is "in a sense making a pilgrimage to Christ present in them." Indulgences for works of mercy can be received multiple times throughout the jubilee year, even daily, according to the Decree.

The Vatican Decree states: "Despite the rule that only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day, the faithful who have carried out an act of charity on behalf of the souls in purgatory, if they receive holy Communion a second time that day, can obtain the plenary indulgence twice on the same day, **applicable only to the deceased."**

Fasting: Acts of penance can also obtain a plenary indulgence. The Vatican lists several options, including: Abstaining for at least one day a week from "futile distractions," such as social media or television. Fasting. Peter Hearn MSC




