Fr Alo writes...

Source of Life and Love

I said Mass for the Year Six on Friday morning, to begin the new year of education. There was a gospel about trusting in God and don't worry too much on what we are going to do and have in the future. The Gospel spoke to me personally while I am packing up before departing to Victoria. There are three kinds of worries within me. First, "am I taking enough things for the new place?". The Second, "worrying about people of Kensington that I am going to leave behind – feeling sad". And the third, "Am I going to be loved by the new community like this community?" These kind of worries, clearly tell me that there is lack of trust within me. I have forgotten that God the source of life and love will continue to look after me. And it is because I do not pray enough. Prayer is about relationship and I need to reinforce my attitude of prayer even though I am busy with other things.

The Gospel of this weekend speaks about Jesus who was busy with His mission. He went from one village to the other to proclaim the Good News and healed the sick. In the middle of his busy time, he did not neglect his communion with the Father. He spent His time early in the morning and late night to communicate with the Father, the source of life and love. Only in communion with the Father, He is able to do His mission.

We are all called to do our mission in the family, community and larger society. As disciples of Jesus let us imitate Jesus our master in recognising the source of our life and love, which is God himself. In the middle of our busy time of mission we may spend some time to have some forms of communication with God. Let us also pray for ourselves but also for others who haven't got enough time to pray. As Jesus also prays for us when He prays to the Father: "I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for those whom You have given Me, for they are Yours. And all Mine are Yours, and Yours are Mine, and I am glorified in them (John 17:9-10).


