

Fr Alo writes ...

Faith and Uncertainty

I was very fortunate to have my private retreat at a property that belongs to one of our parishioners. It was a time to be ME. I was blessed to be on my own in my daily encounter with the Lord for five days. A time of prayer, reading, reflecting and relaxing. I prepared different kinds of food, which would be enough to prevent me from going out of the property except for exercise. In one of my readings, I was struck with the phrase "Faith is about uncertainty", in the book "Awareness" written by Anthony de Mello. I brought this to my prayer. I would say that in some sense this phrase is speaking a lot about my faith journey. There are lots of uncertainties along the way of our faith pilgrim.

The Story of Jesus walking on the lake this weekend, is not about Jesus who is demonstrating his divine power. It is about Jesus who appears anytime in our daily life. The disciples were battling with a heavy sea, for there was a head-wind. In the middle of struggles, Jesus appears to them and calms them down by giving them his own assurance "Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid". His presence brings peace.

And I experienced in that retreat. In the middle of my own struggles in dealing with different issues in my life, Jesus seemed to appear in that retreat to give me assurance of his presence, even though I am not certain with things that are uncertain. After coming back from that retreat, I found myself at PEACE and REFRESHED. However, a few days later, I faced another issue. I thought, was that my prayer answered during the retreat? Why am I facing another one? I found myself like Peter who was doubting his ability to cross the sea to come closer to Jesus. I and Peter probably not just doubted our ability to cross the sea but also had doubts about the Lord's assurance of his care and love.

Today you and I are reminded that we are traveling with the Lord. It doesn't mean that we have no issues anymore. It doesn't mean that we will not face any uncertainty. We will still have to face all this. One thing that we need to be sure of is that the Lord is with us. Have courage.

COVID-19 UPDATE

The NSW Government has recommended parishioners wear face masks when attending religious services as an additional safeguard to help combat the spread of COVID-19.

Church attendance numbers are limited to a maximum of 100 people, providing there is a four square metre space around each person, with the exception of people from the same household.



All parishes must ensure that their churches are not left unattended when their doors are open and must keep written records with names and contact details of everyone who comes into the church/Parish House at any time (at least one person from each family group). These records are kept for at least 4 weeks.

JRS APPEAL FOR FOODBANK DONATIONS

The Jesuit Refugee Service mobile food bank is a huge and growing operation. Since 1 April, they have collectively fed more than 5,000 women, children, and men who have lost jobs, been excluded from Federal Government financial support and cannot return home. In one week alone they fed close to 800 people, including by providing more than 300 kg of rice, 300 kg of pasta, 300 litres of long life milk, 500 cans of tuna and much more! Regardless, **their stocks of rice, pasta, oil, tuna, and long life milk are RUNNING LOW.** If you can donate these items we have drop off spots around Sydney. SUPPORT FOR THE HOUSE OF WELCOME

The House of Welcome works with people seeking asylum and refugees to provide critical casework, housing, employment, foodbank and emergency living assistance. During COVID-19 the demand for financial assistance has risen. HOW has increased the Emergency Living Package program by 216% to respond to the amplified levels of distress and hardship amongst their clients. In the last few months House of Welcome has delivered emergency assistance and been able to support clients to maintain their tenancies and assisted those who have come to the centre homeless. 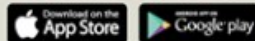
