SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Martin Luther King tells how he had his own Tabor experience. In the height of the struggle for civil rights for black people, one night he suddenly reached rock bottom. He felt he could not go on. He was tired of the insults and injuries.

In this state of exhaustion and despair, he threw himself on his knees before God, and prayed like this:

'Lord, I have taken a stand for what I believe is right. But now I am afraid. The people are looking to me for leadership. If I stand before them without strength and courage, they too will falter. But I am at the end of my powers. I have nothing left I've come to the point where I can't face it alone.'

He says that at that moment He experienced the presence of God in a way he had never experienced it before.

On the strength of that experience He was able to continue the struggle.

What about us? What Tabor experiences have we had in our own lives?



6 WEEKS OF LENT – GIVE 6 THINGS

Right now, JRS is feeding 1000 people a week and the demand for help keeps growing. COVID-19 has disproportionately affected the lives of people seeking asylum and temporary migrants in Australia, as they remain excluded from all forms of Federal government support. This has meant that people who were once working and self-sufficient have had to rely on charities, like JRS, for rent, medication, bills and food.

To help keep everyone fed, we are asking parishioners to donate one item a week:

- Week 1: Basmati Rice (1kg or 2kg bags)
- Week 2: Tuna in oil
- Week 3: Cooking oil (750ml/1L or 2L bottles)
- Week 4: Tinned Tomatoes
- Week 5: Tinned Lentils/Chickpeas/Red Kidney Beans
- Week 6: Pasta (spaghetti, penne, spiral, etc... please not tinned spaghetti)

Food donations can be dropped off either at the Parish House or in the boxes in the church foyer.
